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# **FOOD FOR THOUGHT: Construction Scams**

It's that time of year again, when people start looking to make home repairs. Please be vigilant in vour research when selecting individuals or companies. Always check references, ask for insurance, and never pay for the work before it is done. Often contractors require a deposit, but do your research first and it should never exceed 50% of the project. You can verity their license by contacting your state or local licensing agency. Avoid hiring door to door inquiries. Above all sign a contract and get everything in writing. No reputable company would ask you to pay 30% or more to them up front to order supplies, materials or equipment. If they are a legit company they will have a credit line with those providers and will not need your money to secure them. Some may ask for a down payment up to 10% to provide that you are serious and

want the work done. But this is rare.

### What to do if you have been scammed?

- 1—Recognize that you have been scammed.
- 2-Report the scam to police and/or local authorities.
- 3—Cease all contact with the scammer immediately.
- 4-Educate yourself-it's your best protection.

# Would you like to tour Mars?



Would you ever like to travel to another planet? Maybe not, but here is a chance to check out Mars from the comfort of your own home.

Follow this link <u>https://accessmars.withgoogle.com/</u> and you can see Mars from the view of NASA's Curiosity rover. You can explore the planet Mars and learn about the rover as well by scrolling over certain areas of the rover.

One thing that makes the Curiosity stand out is its sheer size: Curiosity is about the size of a small SUV. It is 9 feet 10 inches long by 9 feet 1 inch wide and about 7 feet high. Looking at the picture, it might look like it was the size of a remote control vehicle that your kids or grandkids would play with but on the contrary, its quite large. In March 2018, it celebrated 2,000 sols (Mars days) on the planet, making its way from Gale Crater to Aeolis Mons, where it has looked at geological information embedded in the mountain's layers. Along the way it also has found extensive evidence of past water and geological change.
